

Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Rule Update



Overview Of The Rule



- CMS published the HCBS final rule amending regulations on January 16, 2014
- The rule ensures that individuals receiving services through waiver programs have full access to the benefits of community living
- The rule further expands the opportunities for meaningful community integration in support of the goals of the ADA and the Supreme Court decision in Olmstead

Steps Accomplished



Creating the foundation

- Initial Statewide Transition Plan approved by CMS
- Everyday Lives: Values in Action
- Waiver amendments to align services with the rule
- Chapter 6100 regulations



Steps In Process - Residential



- Heightened Scrutiny Residential
 - Onsite Tools released for public comment, final versions available at

https://www.dhs.pa.gov/contact/DHS-Offices/Pages/ODP-HCBS%20Final%20Rule.aspx

- 4 homes will have an onsite review completed by ODP staff
 - ✓ Farmstead
 - ✓ Gated Community
 - √ Campus

Steps In Process - CPS



- Heightened Scrutiny Community Participation Support/Day Habilitation
 - Draft onsite tools and identified locations will be released for 45 day public comment period.
 - ODP staff will complete onsite reviews for settings that are co-located or adjacent to:
 - √ Skilled Nursing Facility
 - ✓Intermediate Care Facility
 - √ Hospital



- Residential Heightened Scrutiny Homes that are found to be designed to isolate people will be given the opportunity to create and implement a plan to achieve compliance.
- Homes that choose to not take steps to become compliant will become ineligible for waiver services.
- Homes will not be submitted to CMS for Heightened Scrutiny based on physical location. ODP regulations and service definitions require compliance for integration.




- CPS/Day Hab Heightened Scrutiny CPS/Day
 Hab settings that meet the following will be published for
 public comment and then submitted to CMS for
 Heightened Scrutiny
 - Are co-located or adjacent to a Skilled Nursing Facility, Intermediate Care Facility or Hospital; and
 - 2. Currently meet requirements or have a plan to meet requirements
- CPS/Day Hab settings that choose to not take steps to become compliant will become ineligible for waiver services

CPS – Community Involvement Now




% of Service Recipients with Service Units >= 25% in Community

- Final Statewide Transition Plan Submission to CMS for Approval
 - Assessment of compliance for a sample of service locations through:
 - √ Heightened Scrutiny Onsite Reviews
 - ✓ Licensing
 - ✓ Quality Assessment and Improvement
 - ✓ CPS/Day Habilitation Transition Plan Review



- Ongoing compliance will be assessed through:
 - Licensing

- Quality Assessment and Improvement
- A form must be completed for new service locations. ODP staff verify the service location is not located next to another residential or day service location.
