#### **Budget: Foundations of Health**

- ODP Multi-Year Growth Strategy
  - The Shapiro Administration is beginning a multi-year strategy to expand access to home and community-based services and effectively end the emergency waiting list for adults with intellectual disabilities and autism.
    - · Shifting to management by budget rather than slots; and
    - Adding waiver program capacity to Community Living and Consolidated Waivers.
      - Immediately releasing additional waiver capacity additional 1,250 Community Living and 400 Consolidated
      - Increasing waiver capacity for 2024-25 additional 1,250 Community Living and 250 Consolidated
    - Increasing rates beginning July 1, 2024 \$483M total investment (\$217M state funds)
- One-Time Supplemental Payments
  - ODP will issue one-time supplement payments to support staffing recruitment and retention to enable them to serve additional individuals.
    - Payment to providers anticipated in May/June 2024 \$109M (\$51M state funds)
- Sign Language Interpretation in ODP Waiver Programs
  - Improves access to sign language services for ODP programs -- \$2.1M (\$934,000 state fund)



#### **ODP Multi-Year Program Growth Strategy**


- February 2024, the Shapiro Administration announced the ODP Multi-Year Program Growth Strategy aimed at eliminating the emergency waiting list for adults.
- Program expansion will be accomplished through
  - adding waiver capacity to the Community Living and Consolidated waivers
  - 2. altering the management of waiver capacity in order to serve more people.
- Launch coupled with supplemental payment and Governor's proposed budget for \$214M in rate increases because people should have access to high quality HCBS.



#### **Adding Waiver Capacity**

- February release of additional 1,250 Community Living and 400 Consolidated waivers
- Governor's proposed budget FY24-25 includes \$34.2 million in Community Waiver and \$1.9 million in the Community Base Program
  - 1,250 Community Living and 250 Consolidated
- As overall waiver capacity grows, so do opportunities for enrollment through turnover
  - 4% turnover annually
  - Example, if ODP serves 40,000 people in the waiver programs, approximately 1,600 new people could be enrolled in the waiver annually through turnover

### **Program Capacity Management**

Historically, capacity limited at state and county/AE level to number of "slots" approved to fill in each HCBS waiver

New allocation strategy AE/counties manage to both budget and available waiver slots. Strong management practices and utilization reviews will result in access to additional waiver capacity.

#### **Next Steps**

- Mid-year allocation distribution occurred in February 2024
- Beginning 7/1/2024 new allocation to AEs to include budget limits and maximum number of waivers that may be assigned
  - ODP will conduct readiness reviews
  - AEs rolled in as demonstrate readiness.
- Training AE fiscal and program staff in new approach
- AEs develop tools and practices for utilization review practices
- Create new reports to share program growth and focus on emergency status
- Policy guidance and review of existing policy for update or obsolete



#### **Performance-Based Contracting Update**

- Residential Strategic Thinking Group drafted performance measures – 11/1/23 draft
- Drafting 1915(b)(4) and amendments to 1915(c) waivers
  - Public comment period anticipated in April for 1/1/25 implementation
- Residential Provider Preparedness Toolkit in development
- Supports Coordination Strategic Thinking Group
  - Began meeting in 12/2023
  - Drafting SCO performance measures
- RFP for Performance Analysis Services posted on eMarketplace

# Specialized Telehealth and Assessment Team (STAT)

- Currently one vendor enrollment in process, StationMD
- ODP working to provide files to counties for currently enrolled individuals for batch authorizations
- Dependent on vendor enrollment but we anticipate this being complete before 4/30
- Stakeholder communications
  - Once vendor on board, ODP will host information session
  - One pagers will be available for SCs to use
  - PAFN



# Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) Settings Rule

- CMS approved PA's Statewide Transition Plan 8/24/23
  - Approved plan and letter
  - ODP has no settings unable to comply
- On-going assessment for compliance with HCBS Rule
  - Incorporated into 55. Pa Code 2380, 2390, 6400 and 6500, evaluated through licensing inspections
  - Incorporated into 55 Pa Code 6100, evaluated through ODP's Quality Assessment and Improvement process
  - Individual monitoring by Supports Coordinators



# Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) Rule (cont.)

- Stakeholder call
- CMS will conduct an on-site visit the full week of February 26, 2024
  - Assess implementation of the HCBS Rule with focus on:
    - Person-centered planning and Supports Coordination
    - CAP/milestones
  - At least 7 service location visits
    - Interviews with individuals, DSPs, Supports Coordinators
  - Supports/Service Coordination Meeting



### Intellectual Disability/Autism (ID/A) Supportive Housing Pilot

- Pilot design approved by ISAC Dec 2023 meeting
